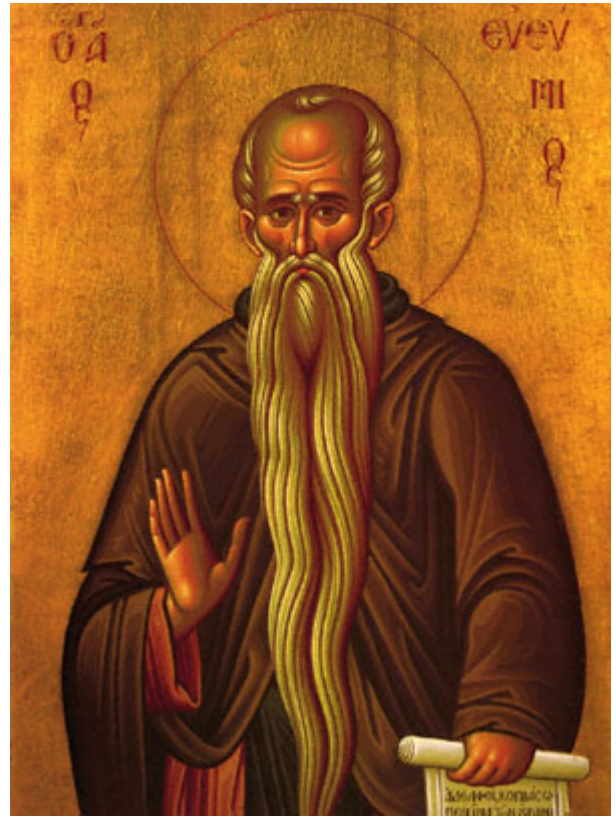

Immediately after the Divine Liturgy, Philoptochos will be offering our parishioners a pancake and sausage breakfast for \$5.00. This cost will be refunded to all blood donors. A sign-up schedule will be available in the weeks prior to the drive for you to select a donation time slot. The Big Red Bus will be on property for several hours into the afternoon. All are invited to attend a Philoptochos General Meeting in the Aegean Hall beginning at about noon, which will include an informative Health Presentation. Afterward we will work together to create Heart Pillows that will be distributed to cardiac units in local hospitals during the month of February, which is Heart Health Month. We pray you will choose to devote your day to Christian Fellowship, and your hearts to supporting our Blood Drive and the Sew-Much-Love Project.

On January 1, 2012, there will be the annual cutting of the Vasilopita for the New Year. On the 8th we will pass the basket for St. Basil's Academy. This is their main fund raiser, so please be generous in your support.

Food Collections Changes

We wish to thank our Holy Trinity community for your generous support of the Philoptochos food collection. Since the Ephraim Project has been benefiting the most from your generosity, we also take this opportunity to celebrate the recent partnering of the Ephraim Project with Second Harvest Food Bank. In light of this new arrangement, we are modifying our plea to you regarding your contributions.

Sponsoring can be the most cost effective way to feed the homeless. Food can now be purchased through Second Harvest for only pennies on the dollar. This means that a cash donation can be multiplied tenfold and more, dramatically increasing the number of meals that can be provided to those in need. So, in addition to donating packaged foods, you can now get a bigger bang for your buck by making a small cash donation to our Ephraim collection container, to be found near the candles in the Narthex. Where else can your dollar spend like 10?

Meanwhile, our collection basket will remain in the Narthex for food donations. The negative economy has hit thousands of families hard, and they are living on the edge of poverty. Very often after paying the rent, the utilities, and other basics, there is simply no money left for such essentials as food. Wicklow Elementary School in Sanford has found the means to provide food to students at risk of hunger through Operation Backpack. We are trying to help supply their food pantry with donated portion-sized foods to be discreetly distributed to students for consumption in their place of residence. Individual cereal boxes, juices, snack bars, easy open cans of pasta, pretzels, pop tarts, instant oatmeal, crackers, tuna, soup, pudding and fruit cups are some of the kinds of foods that can be easily packed in a bag for a hungry child. Please keep this in mind when you are shopping.

We will also continue to collect your contributions of the toiletries and personal hygiene products we all take for granted. Do this "work greater than miracles" through your regular cash and food donations, and your contributions of the necessities required to properly care for the "body of Christ" here in Orlando, and be blessed, in the New Year and always.

"At the end of life we will not be judged by how many diplomas we have received, how much money we have made, or how many great things we have done. We will be judged by: 'I was hungry, and you gave me something to eat, I was naked and you clothed me. I was homeless, and you took me in.' Hungry not only for bread - but hungry for love. Naked not only for clothing - but naked of human dignity and respect. Homeless not only for want of a home of bricks - but homeless because of rejection."

MISSIONS MINISTRY

Ephraim Project has gained access to shop for food from the Second Harvest Food Bank. This means we can buy food for making homeless meals at greatly reduced prices (For example, meat can be purchased for \$0.18 / lb.), so we can offer more meals with the same budget.

10,400 meals were served to the needy by volunteers like you from January to end of September this year alone! The year end total will be about **13,867 meals!**

Without the help of any endowments or federal aid, **73% of the Ephraim Project's 2012 budget will go to directly benefiting the needy** – that's 73 cents per dollar you donate! Of course, with endowments, that percentage would greatly increase!

On average, volunteers are distributing 1,317 pieces of clothing and shoes every month – that's about **15,800 clothing items** per year!

Volunteers will give out **5,108 hygiene products** by year's end!

One hundred and twenty people have been taken off the streets, many with families. They have a place to stay, opportunities to apply for jobs, professional cloths to wear to interviews, and access to basic transportation. They have been given guidance by volunteers to fill out the right forms and take advantage of appropriate government programs.

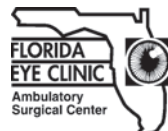
